We also provide those charged with governance with a statement that we have complied with relevant ethical requirements regarding independence, and to communicate with them all relationships and other matters that may reasonably be thought to bear on our independence, and where applicable, related safeguards.

Report on Other Legal and Regulatory Requirements

- m) The maximum and minimum of the members of the Managing Committee is maintained.
- n) The Meetings are held regularly as provided in Rules & Regulations.
- o) The Minutes Books of the proceedings of the meeting is maintained.
- p) None of the members of the Managing Committee have any interest in the investments of the Trust.
- q) None of the members of the Managing Committee is a debtor or a creditor of the Trust.
- r) No irregularities were pointed out by the Auditors in the accounts of the previous year.

NOTES TO AND FORMING PART OF ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31.03.2024

1. <u>Background of the Trust</u>

CVO CHARTERED & COST ACCOUNTANTS ASSOCIATION is a Public Charitable Trust under Maharashtra Public Trust Act, 1950.

(i) <u>Method of Accounting</u>

(iv) <u>Fixed Assets</u>

Fixed assets are stated at cost of acquisition, less accumulated depreciation. The cost of fixed assets includes the purchase cost of fixed assets and any other directly attributable costs of bringing the assets to their working condition for the intended use.

(v) <u>Depreciation</u>

Depreciation is provided on written down value method at rates and as per method prescribed under the prevalent Income-tax Rules for the year ended 31-03-2024.

(vi) <u>Corpus, Earmarked and Other General Funds:</u>

Donation received with specific directions is credited directly to the Earmarked & Other Funds in the balance sheet.

Life Membership Fees are credited to Corpus Fund.

Other donations are accounted for in the year of receipt and credit to Income & Expenditure account as Voluntary Contribution.

The excess of income over expenditure during the year, being general purpose in nature is carried forward for use in the periods.

(vii) <u>Revenue Recognition</u>

Interest Income: Interest income are recognised in Income and Expenditure Account for all interest-bearing instruments on an accrual basis at applicable interest rate.

Rental Income: Rent income is recognised in Income and Expenditure account on accrual basis. **Membership fees** is recognized on an accrual basis for the period for which the fees is received

Income from subscription to events/workshops, is recognized on the commencement of the program/event for which the subscription is received

Income from other receipts, if any, is recognized when the associated obligation is performed and right to receive money is established.

Event related expenses are recognized on occurrence of the Event
